## Asian Convention 2010 on board the



The Asian Convention 25th – 28th July, 2010 was a resounding success on two counts: we not only gathered believers to celebrate and proclaim the Lordship of Jesus Christ on board the luxurious cruise ship, SuperStar Virgo but we managed to bring together 465 participants from 13 different countries to explore ways to evangelize and reclaim the 7 mountains of culture for the Kingdom of God. These 7 mountains of culture are:

1. Church, Kingdom and Nation
2. Government and Law
3. Education
4. Business and Finance
5. Family
6. Media and Communication
7. Entertainment and Arts.

The Organizing Committee was headed by Bro Tan Tek Seng, the National President of FGBMF Malaysia who was assisted by a group of enthusiastic leaders namely Bro James Kui, Bro Edmund Chan, Bro Fong Hoong Heng, Bro David Yap, Bro Richard Ling, Bro Steven Toh, Bro Billy Lee, Bro Vernon Lai and Bro Damien Chua. They were advised by Bro Lee Gee Koon and Dr Wong Hong Meng from the Governing Council, FGBMF Malaysia.

The convention theme was “Kingdom Ambassadors in the Marketplace” taken from 2 Corinthians 5:20. We were blessed by the sharing of seven prominent and influential Christian businessmen who shared on how God used them as vessels of transformation in their spheres of businesses.

There were seven sessions in the convention as follows:

### Session 1 – Church, Kingdom and Nation

The speaker for this session was Bro Khoo Oon Theam who is the National President of Full Gospel Business Men's Fellowship (Singapore). The essence of his talk was that believers are gatekeepers who are Ambassadors and Ministers in the Marketplace. As gatekeepers they are to transform the culture of the gates with Kingdom principles and to disciple gatekeepers in the marketplace. This will eventually transform the marketplace and the nation.

### ▶ Session 2 – Government and Law

Datuk Chua Jui Meng, the former Health Minister of Malaysia was the speaker for this session. He emphasized the importance of Government and Law as it affects all the other mountains. He said all believers must pray for those in authority so that they will have the fear of God in their lives and uphold the rule of law and justice in the country. He encouraged Christians to be more involved in the government and the formulation of policies as these will affect the welfare of the citizens.



### ▶ Session 4 – Business and Finance

Datuk Tony Tiah, the Executive Chairman of TA Enterprise Bhd, spoke on how Christian Businessmen should transform their ways of conducting business. He opined that they should practice high ethical standards, reliability and integrity in all their dealings. By doing so they will be channels of influence and blessings to the world around them.



### ▼ Session 3 – Education

Dato' Peter Ng, President of the UCSI Group who was the speaker for this session, stressed that to attain wisdom, men must attain a high level of education especially the knowledge of God's Word. Thus Christian leaders with their knowledge and wisdom should permeate all strata of society so that they can influence others to do the right things, especially in nation building.

### ▶ Session 5- Family

The speaker for this session, Datuk Paul Low, the Malaysian President of Transparency International, highlighted the importance of the family structure as the basic foundation for the strength and stability of the country. When there are strong and stable families in the country there will be peace, harmony and goodwill at all levels of society. Thus Christians should strive to set good examples for others to emulate, by becoming salt (adding taste to society) and light, thus preserving society.



Mark Thorn, CEO of Octillion.tv and Managing Director of StreamIT emphasized that the activities of Christian leaders should be reported in the media so that their good works can be read by others. They should communicate the way of peace, love and reconciliation especially in a multi-racial and multi-cultural environment.

## Session 7 - Entertainment and Arts

Bro Hugo Chan, National Director of Full Gospel Business Men's Fellowship International Hong Kong, underscored the potential of using Entertainment and Arts to evangelize. This is because there are those who would not step inside a church but would not mind listening to a song or hearing a message presented to them in a non-confrontational way. Thus he encouraged more believers to be involved in this mountain and wield their influence on this sadly neglected group.



**A**sk any self-made businessman their secrets of success, and they'd regale you with their rags-to-riches story – 99% perspiration, 1% genius and all that. Having built their abundance through blood, sweat and tears, it's not easy for these tycoons to see a need for Jesus in their lives.

Successful businessmen are tough nuts, they say. But businessman Tan Tek Seng believes that the key to cracking the toughest nut is the love of God.

"What self-made businessmen fear most is losing everything," says Tan. "Most have a lack of love. They aspire to be loved and either demand it, seek pleasure to get it or buy expensive stuff to show the world their material wealth.

"They can have billions, but the wealth will not bring them to eternity," he adds. "By sharing my testimony, how the Lord has touched me, and the love of God through Jesus, I allow them to see that, while all they have are temporal, there's such a thing as eternal life."

## Two Miracles

By many counts, Tan was a tough nut himself. Described by his wife as "hot tempered and unreasonable," he was known to sack his staff on the spot for the smallest mistakes. In His grace, God used two key events – the "baby miracle" and the "road tax miracle" – to break through the hardest of hearts and turn it to Him.

In the "baby miracle", God gifted Tan and his wife, Tinkie, a baby boy, eight years after their second daughter was born. Through a miraculous healing in her sixth month of pregnancy, when she was in danger of losing the baby, Tinkie accepted Jesus. She started attending church with her two daughters, much to her husband's annoyance.

After "persecuting" his wife for three-and-a-half years, Tan surprised everybody one day when he decided to get baptized with Tinkie. He had been suffering many sleepless nights due to the increasing burdens and mounting debts of his expanding business. He became silently envious of the peace his wife exuded, which led him to search for something more in life. He told the church elders before they agreed to baptize him: "I don't want to argue or ask too many questions; I just want to accept Jesus like a child."

From that day, Tan started attending church with his family. However, he remained lukewarm in his faith ... until the "road tax miracle" in 1997. The family were on the way to a church outing, stopping on the way for a drink at a teh tarik

stall. In the second half of the journey, Tan discovered that his road tax had fallen off. In a foul mood, he decided to turn back for home. Somehow, Tinkie felt a prompting to stop at the same stall again, and she told her husband to ask the teh tarik man if he saw their road tax.

Begrudgingly, Tan went down. To his surprise, the teh tarik man said that the wind had blown the road tax to him a short while back. Due to his pride, Tan just pocketed the road tax and returned to the car in silence. As he started the car engine, though, he suddenly broke down in tears. Immediately, his three children hugged him, saying, "Dad, don't cry. We love you; Jesus loves you; Jesus has forgiven you."

"That was the turning point for me," says Tan. "I felt the presence of God and turned 180 degrees." Since then, there has been no looking back.

## To the Marketplace

Today, with three grown children and two grandchildren, Tan and his wife spend their days ministering to people in the marketplace. One such avenue is the Full Gospel Business Men's Fellowship (FGBMF). From heading a chapter in his own office back in 1997, Tan is now the National President of FGBMF, Malaysia.

Dispelling the notion that the FGBMF is a social club, he says, "It's a soul-winning club where we see lives transformed, marriages restored and bad habits eliminated." Between 2000 and 2005, the FGBMF brought many tycoons throughout Malaysia to share their testimonies in more than 500 outreach meetings, which has resulted in thousands coming to the faith.

"These people are able to reach out to those who are often unreachable by pastors," he notes. "We believe every businessman is called into the marketplace and our business and career are our mission field and ministry. We use this platform to reach out to people who won't step into a church but wouldn't mind going to a business meeting." Tan desires to raise up 200 men in the next few years to impact the lives of other business people and take the nation for Jesus.

Tan was also instrumental in bringing GoodTV (<http://gtvmy.com>) to Malaysia in May 2009. Based in Taiwan, Good TV is the world's first Chinese Christian broadcasting network, spreading the gospel through family-oriented programmes via satellite and the Internet.

## The Full Gospel

Tan himself has ridden the waves of economic storms – from an imminent public listing to multi-million dollar debts –

and through it all, he can attest to God's guiding hand and deliverance. "The difference between believer and non-believer business people is that when faced with a problem, we can go back to our 'manual' and follow God's leading on how to chart our lives," he says. "As I wait upon the Lord, ideas just drop into my mind and I know what to do; the peace of God is an important guiding factor. The next time I go through the same problem, I can overcome faster as I know God is going through the situation with me."

"God has been so amazing," says Tinkie, "Having gone through the different stages of our lives and experienced the pains and difficulties, we can now use our testimony to speak into other people's lives." Talking to Tan and his wife, one can't help but sense their excitement as they relate story after story of people whom God had brought into their paths.

There's the laptop story: While having coffee with a wealthy friend in Hong Kong, Tan's laptop was stolen. Surprisingly, Tan did not show any signs of anxiety over the loss. He told his friend, "My father is very rich; He will give me a better computer." A week later, over dinner, the same friend was burdened with cash flow problems. "He asked to meet up with my rich Father so He can invest in his project," says Tan. "That night itself, in the restaurant, he said the sinner's prayer."

Then there's the CEO story: Tan was chased out not once but twice while trying to share the gospel with a certain CEO. One day, through, Tan received a call from the CEO's wife who asked him to pray for her husband who was in a coma. The CEO had been suddenly terminated from his high-paying job; his friends deserted him, and he went into depression, overdosing on sleeping pills. Tan prayed for the CEO, who woke up from his coma and gave his life to Jesus in the hospital. "When he passed away years later, I was asked to be the funeral director," Tan says. "His grown-up children and his entire household came to the Lord."

While Tan has a way with the rich and famous, he's equally at ease with the man-on-the-street.

There's the lottery ticket lady story: While eating nga choy kai (chicken with bean sprouts) in Ipoh, Tan and his friends were approached by an elderly lottery ticket seller. One friend dismissed her, saying that as Christians they don't buy lottery tickets. As she walked off, the lady grumbled, "If I meet Christians all my life, I'll be hungry to death." Tan bought five lottery tickets and returned the tickets to her. "I invited her for Chinese tea, and in 5 minutes, shared the love of God and Jesus to her. She gave her life to Jesus."

There's also the CCTV story: A contractor came to fix a faulty camera in Tan's factory. Tan sensed that he was in trouble

and found out that the contractor had lost a lot of money in the stock market; on top of that, his latest batch of CCTVs seemed to be "jinxed" as many were faulty. Tan invited him into his office, shared his testimony and the love of God over coffee, and the contractor accepted the Lord.

The contractor also mentioned that he had to call a temple medium to his cousin's factory, which was supposedly haunted. "I told him that now that he was a Christian, he only needed to bring Jesus," says Tan, who went along to the cousin's factory, bringing olive oil and a shofar. There, he saw a possessed Indonesia worker. Exercising the power of the Holy Spirit, he drove the demons out of the lady. After anointing her with oil, her distorted face was transformed. "The lady boss was so amazed, she wanted to buy the oil from me," says Tan. "I asked her and her accounts clerk to give their lives to Jesus on the spot."

When the husband came, the lady boss told him what happened. "I told him that as the head of the company, he had to fill up his heart and house with God's spirit, else the demons that had been driven out would come back," says Tan. "On that day, six people got saved!"

For all of Tan's corporate and financial successes, nothing beats the joy of seeing lives turned over to Jesus. "My husband has a passion for souls." Says Tinkie. "God has given him that anointing."

Indeed, Tan is seeing the fulfillment of a personal prophecy that was given to him in December 2005. It states, among others, that God will give him an apostolic gift in the marketplace, that he will connect people across nations and cities, and he will have favour with people from high places and have provision from the authorities.

"The Lord revealed to us recently that the 'full gospel man' is full in everything, complete," says Tinkie. "Isaiah 61:1 says that with the anointing of the Lord, we can preach good news, bind up the broken hearted, free the captives and release the prisoners. We believe this is the verse for end-time marketplace ministry."

Tan concurs, adding, "Most importantly, it is the manifestation of the love of Christ in us."

## Rev. Chang Chih Shuong's Healing and Deliverance Rally/ Teaching sessions in Malaysia – 7-21 Jan 2010

Rev. Chang together with 3 assistant pastors, Ps. Yaw, Ps. Chang and Ps. Lee arrived on 6 Jan evening and stayed at Luther Centre. The rest of the team members arrived from Sabah and Singapore on the next day.

The first teaching session started at 7.30pm, 7 Jan. Thursday at Luther Centre with 120 attendees. Among them were pastors and leaders from various KL/PJ Churches and FGB members. The teaching session continued on Friday, 8 Jan at 7.30pm and whole day on Sat 9 Jan from 9am to 10pm and was well received with many healed and set free of bondages.

On Sunday, 10 Jan, the team splitted into 2 teams, one team led by Rev. Chang to preach in Setapak Lutheran Church at 9am, and another for Sunday service at Taman Midah Lutheran Church at 11am. The other team was led by Ps Yaw to FGA Kepong. There were all together 35 souls saved at all 3 Sunday services, with many healed and set free of bondages.

The 2 day public rallies held at Luther Centre was attended by many, with 40 souls saved and many healed of various sicknesses. Both nights ended at around midnight and many were healed and set free of bondages.

The team were joined by 4 KL FGBMF members and 5 KL pastors, left PJ Shah Village hotel at 9am, Tuesday 12 Jan and headed for Ipoh, where a group of 15 local pastors were waiting at the restaurant in YMCA. The lunch organized by FGBMF Chapters was another eye opener, where REV Chang challenged and encouraged not only the local pastors but also our FGBMF members to work and extend His Kingdom in Ipoh.



Edmund Chan, Northern Regional Director hosted the whole team at his residence at Taman Jesselton, Penang, while Penang Air Hitam Methodist Chinese Church together with 3 other local Churches hosted the night rally, where 24 souls were saved, and subsequently the place of worship was turned into a hospital, with more than 200 people were seeking for healing. The team had a very hectic time up to midnight before we called it a day at 1.30am in the morning. At least 2 local pastors were impressed by the work of the Holy Spirit and immediately requested Rev. Chang's training to be conducted soon in Penang.

The team stayed over at Hatyai for a night to study the spiritual atmosphere of Thailand with intention to

penetrate the nation with the gospel through healing and deliverance. The team managed to visit 3 local Churches, which were basically Thai and membership was small.

At Alor Star, we had 2 afternoon teaching sessions from 3-6pm, on 14 & 15 January at FGA Alor Star. There were some 40 attendees, mainly local Church leaders attended the sessions. A few pastors travelled as far as Penang just to attend the teaching sessions, and they shared that they had not attended anything like that before. Both nights healing/Deliverance rallies were attended by some 400 people, and salvation were around 38, and once again the Church was turned into a hospital after the alter call for salvation. Various sickness were cured and bondage delivered. The group had to work hard till mid night again before we could go for supper at 1am in the morning.

We left Alor Star on Sat, 16 Jan morning after a breakfast fellowship with the local FGBMF men, and crossed over to the east coast via the East-West highway. The journey was long and twice the bus broke down while climbing the mountainous path. However, with determination and powerful prayers, we managed to get to the Kota Baru rally venue just 20 minutes before it started. The evil ones were trying very hard to undermine us but they fled at the end.

Hallelujah, Praise the Lord for ever more!

We had 27 souls saved at the rallies at Kota Baru, but the numbers responding for both nights for healing were in the hundreds!

Thank God FGBMF was able to help even the small Churches in the East coast where most pastors do not wish to serve

there to bring in the harvest. What we did might be a small thing in nature, but it was a big encouragement to the pastors who were determined to be there to work hand in hand with FGBMF.
